Your last drive will be to Arles, famous for its Roman remains and the many artists who lived there, from Van Gogh to Picasso...



THE CITIES DESCRIPTION

SAINT RÉMY

Surrounded by lush green perfumed valleys, its ancient streets are lined with beautifully restored old houses... you will soon be seduced by Saint Remy's charm! While strolling through the narrow winding streets you will discover fantastic old fountains, shady squares, picturesque restaurants and elegant boutiques.

LES BAUX DE PROVENCE

The village Cultural heritage is exceptionally rich, with 22 architectural treasures classified as **Historic Monuments** (including the church, chateau, town-hall, hospital, chapels, houses, doorways...). This immense and superb stone fortress is without doubt one of the **must-sees** on the Provencal tourist trail!

ARLES

City of festivals, art, and culture, Arles has never stopped attracting artists. Van Gogh stayed here with his friend Gauguin. Picasso, a lover of bull fights, was inspired by them to do two paintings and 57 drawings.

The Roman monuments are Unesco's registered.

The houses and private mansions of the 16th century, St. Trophime's cloister and the Hôtel de Ville are all well worth a tour.
